Helpful Tips

Before 10:00 AM - add a zero before the hour. Example: 6:00 AM = zero six hundred (0600)

10:00 AM to 12:00 PM (noon) – remove the colon. Example: 11:00 AM = eleven hundred (1100)

After 12:00 PM (noon) - add twelve hours to the time as it appears on the 12-hour clock. Example: 1:00 PM + 12 hours = thirteen hundred (1300)

To convert from military time to the 12-hour clock, subtract twelve hours from the military time. Example: 2300 – 12 = 1100 or 11:00 PM
